Fresh Stains

(For the treatment of persistent stains: see other side)

INSTRUCTIONS:

First use a spoon to remove loose dirt as good as possible.

Then:

Immediately place a moist cotton cloth (hold it under the cold tap and wring it out) on the stain and leave it to dry completely. Leave the cloth in place without peeking. Should the cloth get saturated, replace it with a fresh cloth until it does not wet through anymore. Then leave the cloth in place to dry completely.

If stains are still visible after treatment, leave them to dry and follow the Staindisc instructions on the other side.

- Treat with water immediately (follow instructions above)
- Treat with James Stainwonder (follow instructions on the other side)
- Treat with James Stainspray on a cotton cloth (follow instructions on the other side)
- Treat immediately with James Stainspray (follow instructions on the other side)
- Treat with James Water (follow instructions on the other side)

Persistent stains

(For the treatment of fresh stains: see other side)

■ INSTRUCTIONS:

Let the surface dry completely. Hold the bottle **James Stainwonder** upside down on the stain and cover the entire area. Follow instructions on label carefully. **on Wool**: as soon as the stain has disappeared, immediately cover the stain with a moist cotton cloth and leave it to dry completely. **For upholstery**: see label.

▲ INSTRUCTIONS:

Spray **James Stainspray** on and possibly under the stain. Leave to soak for 5 minutes. Then, use a spoon to remove loose dirt, spray James Stainspray on a dry cotton cloth and use it to wipe the stain clean using wide sweeping strokes. If necessary, repeat the process.

◇ INSTRUCTIONS:

Thoroughly vacuum clean the carpet or upholstery. Then, spray **James Water** onto a dry cotton cloth and gently wipe the purpose area using wide sweeping strokes. If necessary, repeat the process.

● INSTRUCTIONS:

Spray **James Stainspray** on a dry cotton cloth. Wipe the stain clean with this cloth using wide sweeping strokes. In case the stain partially remains, spray directly onto the carpet or upholstery and wipe the stain dry using wide sweeping strokes.
